There are Travel advisories against visiting Africa, as a result MMM can't field volunteer teams in 2021.

Mr. Khosa, Coordinator of Synod of Livingstonia/Marion Medical Mission Well Program issued this statement to the MMM Board:

"We have worked together and because of this our communities in Africa are safer. You are truly our neighbors. It is important we work together hand in hand on the ground in Africa. But if this is not possible due to covid-19 your African partners are confident 3,000 wells can be and should be built in the year 2021 because the communities need them. The virus is bad, and we have a protocol the Coordinators have established we will follow. However, contaminated drinking water poses a greater and immediate ongoing threat to poor communities. A well means safe drinking water for many vears."

Rev. Mwasakifwa, Coordinator of ELCT Konde Diocese/MMM Well Program who was recovering from covid-19, said: "Safe drinking water means the children won't die and the people will be healthier, year after year."

The Marion Medical Mission Board unanimously, and with great confidence, agreed to set the 2021 well goal at 3,000 and approved the budget needed to achieve this goal. We are excited and optimistic over the limitless possibilities of God's creation. Black people and white people, the poor and the not so poor, Muslim and Christian working together. Marion Medical Mission means loving your neighbor as yourself!

When we pray, we move our feet! In addition to your prayers, the next best, most powerful thing you can do is to share MMM with your friends. EMBANGWENI SCHOOL FOR HARD OF HEARING

The Embangweni School for Hard of Hearing was the first school for the deaf in Northern Malawi founded in 1994 by the Synod of Livinstonia and built with financial support from Marion Medical Mission. Today, the boarding school serves 200 or more students, ages 6-21. They attend pre-school for 3 years, before entering primary school. There is a faculty of 12-14 teachers and support staff. Without this school, children would languish at home, unable to communicate and earn a living.

MMM continues to support the school with transportation scholarships for children who otherwise may not be able to attend; fertilizer and seed and farm tools for the older students to learn agriculture and to plant and harvest the maize essential for the school's food security; carpentry students who graduate from the Vocational Training Center receive a complete set of tools so that they can earn a living. The 2020 carpentry class made 24 beautiful desks and chairs from a large tree that had to be chopped down for school safety.

Our last visit at the school was on November, 2019. Tom and I were excitedly greeted by the children and they welcomed us by signing our name. My sign is "head, shoulders, knees and toes", an activity and song I taught them back in 1996. We were there for the Vocational Carpentry and Joinery graduation. The mothers were so proud and jubilant, dancing around their children, one girl and three boys, as they received their certificates and carpentry tools in a large wooden box they made. They entered the school as preschoolers. It was a celebrated 14 year achievement.

Tom Logan was honored to speak at the Boyton Street Community Center's celebration of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. on January 18, 2021. Tom told how Rev. King had defined his life, and that he'd named his son after him, and that his grandson officially took Martin as his name. One of Tom's favorite Rev. King quotes: "I have decided to stick with love, hate is too great a burden to bear."

Tom took this picture in Selma in March of 1965 after "Bloody Sunday" when John Lewis, future U.S. Congressman from Georgia, led around 600 marchers across the Edmund Pettis Bridge in Selma to protest for voting rights for black citizens. The marchers were met and brutally beaten by law enforcement officers.


